THE BULLETIN ADVERTISING PROCESS

Advertising in the Bulletin is easy and a great way for you to support the SCA. Planning for the next Bulletin issue begins the moment the current issue has been published, so the earlier you notify the Advertising Manager that you are going to advertise the better.

1. Notify the Advertising Manager Jaime Stanchina embraceskips@gmail.com that you wish to place an ad, so that we can allot your ad placement. The earlier you notify us the better. Alternatively, you can go to the SCA Website Bulletin page and pay for your ad up front per the instructions. That will automatically create a notification to the Bulletin to allot your ad space. And then you can contact the Advertising Manager with the ad details.
2. Next, determine what you want the readers to see and learn from this ad (i.e., pictures & verbiage), whether you have a specific theme in mind (i.e., base theme on your dog's name, your kennel name, etc.), or a favourite color, or a color you definitely don't want used in your ad.
3. Select the size ad you want. Remember to make sure the size is appropriate to the amount of content you want to display. Avoid making your ad too busy as that becomes harder to read.
4. Once you have finished steps 2 & 3, scan and send the contents and identified details to the Advertising Manager. Scan pictures at 300 dpi or good quality and make sure all pictures are properly identified. It is easier to downsize the quality of your pictures for the web than it is to improve them. If you don't have a scanner yourself, you can take the content to a photocopy service to have them scanned and either emailed to you to forward, or placed on a memory stick that you can retrieve your files from to attach to the email you send to the Advertising Manager.
5. The Advertising Manager will save your ad contents & email on her computer as a back-up copy for the Bulletin and will also forward it to the Editor (Marnie Layng) to have your ad created.
6. The Editor will be in touch with you by email either to clarify what you want if there is a question, or to send you the drafts of the ad for your review and finally for your approval. Drafts will be marked as drafts until final approval is gained. Draft ads are not to be published in any other medium, i.e., FaceBook, other publication, or personal website, etc.
7. After you have approved the final version of your ad for publication in the Bulletin, the Editor will notify the Advertising Manager to send you an invoice if the ad has not been paid for already.
8. Once the ad invoice has been paid the Advertising Manager will send the advertiser a receipt and the Editor will remove the word/s "draft" from the ad and place it in the Bulletin. ***No advertising will be published until payment has been received by the SCA!***
9. Following the publication of the Bulletin, the Editor will send each advertiser a final copy of their ad to be used as they wish.
10. If you plan on creating your own ad, please follow all the same steps as above, but instead of sending the content and details, just send your final ad copy. Be sure to adhere to the proper dimensions for the ad size you wish to use. For best results please send your ad in jpeg format, or as a Word document. Check with the Advertising Manager if you have questions in that regard.

AKC TEMPERAMENT TEST SUMMARY

On August 27, 2019, the American Kennel Club (AKC) announced the AKC Temperament Test (ATT). The ATT was developed to provide a meaningful evaluation of our canine companions' temperament. There are nearly two-hundred AKC recognized breeds. One of the things that make a specific breed unique is not only their physical appearance, but also its distinctive temperament. The temperament described in the AKC breed standard for Schipperke: curious, interested in environment, watchdog; reserved with strangers; protective if necessary; confident.

The ATT is open to all breeds, including mixed breed dogs one-year or older. The ATT is a non-competitive, pass-fail test that will screen for fear, shyness, inability to recover from unfamiliar or unexpected situations, and lack of cooperation. Examples of undesirable behaviors include being afraid of friendly strangers, obsessive barking, and aggression. Desired traits are a dog that is emotionally stable, inquisitive, appropriately social, biddable, and recovers from a startling situation in a reasonable amount of time. There is no expectation that passing the ATT guarantees any future behavior of the dog. Passing the ATT simply means that the Evaluator saw the dog successfully perform the test items.

What is temperament?

“Temperament has been defined as an animal’s personality, makeup, disposition, or nature. A longer definition of temperament is “individual differences in behavior that are biologically based.” Temperament is not the physical characteristics of a dog, and it is not learned behaviors such as sit, down and stay.

In past several decades, there has been an increase in dog trainer knowledge about behavior. We now know that behavioral procedures can be effectively used to modify behaviors (such as fearful reactions) that may be related to temperament.

Considering that we can change behaviors often related to temperament (such as when a dog refuses to walk on an unfamiliar surface), here is a modern definition of temperament: Temperament is an individual’s natural predisposition to react in a certain way to a stimulus. Behaviors related to temperament may be modified over time with exposure and learning. –*Burch & Ljungren, 2019*”

Temperament testing is not new. Many of us are familiar with Volhard’s Puppy Aptitude Testing (PAT). In fact, several items in the PAT: social, sound sensitivity, sight sensitivity and stability are also in the ATT with similar modes of testing. There are many other popular tests for both puppies and adult dogs. The temperament of any dog is an important characteristic. Personality and temperament are not set in stone at birth. Early puppy testing does not give a completely accurate snapshot of the adult dog, nevertheless these tests are a good way to determine a puppy’s sensitivities and get a realistic view of its early conditioning. Early experience, socialization, [development](#), and the consequences of learning all affect a puppy’s future behavior. Puppies are often tested as early as 7 weeks; however testing later at 3 to 4 months may give results that are more accurate.

American Temperament Test Society, Inc. (ATTS)

Alfons Ertel founded the American Temperament Test Society, Inc. (ATTS) in 1977. ATTS is a national not-for-profit organization for the promotion of uniform temperament evaluation of purebred and altered mixed-breed dogs. The number of dogs tested as of April 2016 is 33,925 with 28,295 dogs earning a Temperament Test (TT) title. The average overall pass rate is 83.4 percent; the pass rate varies by breed. The breed’s temperament, training, health and age of the dog is taken into account.

Clubs send written request to AKC for approval to list the TT as a title. The AKC has approved forty-one parent clubs, including the Schipperke Club of America. There were 130 Schipperkes tested through December 31, 2017. The success rate was 91.5% with 119 dogs passing (11 failed).

Comparing ATT and ATTS

Both ATT and ATTS tests focus on and measure different aspects of temperament such as stability, shyness, aggressiveness, and friendliness. The American Temperament Test Society also tests the dog’s instinct for protectiveness

towards its handler and/or self-preservation in the face of a threat. The tests take into consideration each breed's inherent tendencies. Dogs that show signs of aggression will not pass either test.

The AKC Temperament Test includes test items in the following six categories: social, auditory, visual, tactile (touch), proprioceptive (motion), and unexpected stimulus. Each of the six categories has four choices of test items for a total of 24 possible test items. For every test, the evaluator chooses three of the items for each category (18 total). Walking on a wire grate (tactile) and opening the umbrella (visual) are required in every test. In the ATT, handlers may talk to their dogs, but not excessively. There should be no verbal or leash corrections. Dogs must pass twice under two different evaluators.

Dogs must be at least 18 months old to enter the ATTS test. There are ten sub-tests within five categories. Handlers are not allowed to talk to their dog, give commands, or give corrections. The dog's reactions are monitored for displays of unprovoked aggression, panic, or strong avoidance, all of which would usually be grounds for failure. There are three evaluators; majority rules. Only one pass is required.

The tests simulate a casual walk through the park or neighborhood with everyday life situations. During this walk, the dog experiences auditory, visual and tactile stimuli. The dogs meet neutral and friendly strangers (this is the first part of both tests). They experience unexpected noises. These noises range from coins in a plastic jug (ATT) to three shots fired from .22 caliber starter pistol (ATTS). Other noises are horns, whistles and even a vacuum cleaner. An umbrella opened within a few feet of the dog is in both tests. AKC has additional moving visuals in its test such as roller bag, wagon, crate dolly, streamers or a shaken hand towel.

Both organizations assess the dog's willingness to walk on different surfaces by using an opened exercise pen laid flat on the ground. Other surfaces used by AKC are a wrinkled tarp, plastic lattice over memory foam and pegboard over an air mattress. AKC allows three attempts to walk on these surfaces. The final categories of testing differ substantially. The ATTS uses a weirdly dressed stranger in three scenarios. In the first exposure, the person simply passed the team's path 38 feet away. Next, the stranger advances 10 feet towards the handler in a threatening way. Finally, the weird stranger advances to within 18 feet of the handler in an aggressive manner. This tests the dog's protectiveness towards its handler or its own self-preservation. There is nothing in the ATT similar to these situations.

AKC tests the dog's proprioceptive (motion, body position). The term, "proprioceptive" refers to stimuli that relate to the position and movement of the body. For humans, an example of a proprioceptive exercise might be throwing a baseball without looking at the hand or arm that is throwing the ball. For a dog, a proprioceptive exercise would be walking through a ladder on the ground. Here, the dog needs to be aware of where to place the back feet.

The ATT uses Cavaletti (either PVC ladder or low bars), eight intersection hoops, a piece of plywood that teeters or walking up and over a low platform such as the Klimb™ to test rear-end awareness. Dogs may attempt these up to three times. No lures allowed.

The final category for the ATT is response to unexpected stimulus. Dogs are exposed to any three of the following situations where a person approaches the team. Carrying large box and objects (large doll or large stuffed animal); drops chair; uses walker, crutches, or wheelchair and finally, wearing unusual clothing (raincoat, poncho, hats etc).

At the conclusion of testing, the handler receives a critique about the dog's performance. Both tests are pass/fail. However, the points system used by the AKC ranges from 0-4. A score of four is ideal. This dog is calm and confident with no startle or refusal. In scoring a three, the dog may show fear or brief startle but recovers quickly (within 5 seconds) and succeeds on their first try on tactile or proprioceptive items. These are both passing scores. Dogs that display moderate fear or startle, take a while to recover (within 15 seconds) or needs two tries on tactile or proprioceptive items earn a two. To pass, a dog must have scores of three and four with only one item on the test scored

as one. A one is a nervous or agitated dog that recovers within 30 seconds or needs three tries. Dogs that refuse to do an item receive a zero.

Dogs that do not pass are identified as “needs work.” Tests are not perfect. An advantage of testing is to recognize the potential for negative behaviors from assessment indicators, then diminish or negate these behaviors with interventions such as socialization and proper training. Please see Mary R. Burch, PhD “when Dogs Don’t Pass ATT” (link below).

Exposure and learning can change how a dog reacts to stimuli. Agility and trick dog training are examples of modifying a dog’s behavior through learning and experience. Dogs learn to adjust their weight to tip the teeter, although this shifting is initially unsettling. The banging made by teeter is another distraction to overcome. Through repetition and experience, they gain the skill. Navigating the height of a dogwalk is another “unnatural” behavior. Self-assured dog will run across the surface. Trick dogs confidently cross over raised ladders, assuredly placing each paw on narrow rungs. Dogs learn rear feet awareness in order to back onto elevated objects. Kindness, time and patience can make the difference in how a dog sees the world. A fun adventure, or a scary place; you can change their perspective.

Schipperke Breed Standard (AKC)

General Appearance

The Schipperke is an agile, active watchdog and hunter of vermin. In appearance he is a small, thickset, cobby, black, tailless dog, with a fox-like face. The dog is square in profile and possesses a distinctive coat, which includes a stand-out ruff, cape and culottes. All of these create a unique silhouette, appearing to slope from shoulders to croup. Males are decidedly masculine without coarseness. Bitches are decidedly feminine without over refinement. Any deviation from the ideal described in the standard should be penalized to the extent of the deviation. Faults common to all breeds are as undesirable in the Schipperke as in any other breed, even though such faults may not be specifically mentioned in the standard.

Size, Proportion, Substance

Size—The suggested height at the highest point of the withers is 11-13 inches for males and 10-12 inches for bitches. Quality should always take precedence over size. **Proportion**—Square in profile. **Substance**—Thickset.

Head

Expression—The expression is questioning, mischievous, impudent and alert, but never mean or wild. The well proportioned head, accompanied by the correct eyes and ears, will give the dog proper Schipperke expression.

Skull—The skull is of medium width, narrowing toward the muzzle. Seen in profile with the ears laid back, the skull is slightly rounded. The upper jaw is moderately filled in under the eyes, so that, when viewed from above, the head forms a wedge tapering smoothly from the back of the skull to the tip of the nose. The stop is definite but not prominent. The length of the muzzle is slightly less than the length of the skull.

Eyes—The ideal eyes are small, oval rather than round, dark brown, and placed forward on the head.

Ears—The ears are small, triangular, placed high on the head, and, when at attention, very erect. A drop ear or ears is a disqualification.

Nose—The nose is small and black.

Bite—The bite must be scissors or level. Any deviation is to be severely penalized.

Neck, Topline, Body

Neck—The neck is of moderate length, slightly arched and in balance with the rest of the dog to give the correct silhouette. **Topline**—The topline is level or sloping slightly from the withers to the croup. The stand-out ruff adds to the slope, making the dog seem slightly higher at the shoulders than at the rump. **Body**—The chest is broad and deep, and reaches to the elbows. The well sprung ribs (modified oval) are wide behind the shoulders and taper to the sternum. The forechest extends in front of the shoulders between the front legs. The loin is short, muscular and moderately drawn up. The croup is broad and well-rounded with the tail docked. No tail is visually discernible.

Forequarters

The shoulders are well laid back, with the legs extending straight down from the body when viewed from the front. From the side, legs are placed well under the body. Pasterns are short, thick and strong, but still flexible, showing a slight angle when viewed from the side. Dewclaws are generally removed. Feet are small, round and tight. Nails are short, strong and black.

Hindquarters

The hindquarters appear slightly lighter than the forequarters, but are well muscled, and in balance with the front. The hocks are well let down and the stifles are well bent. Extreme angulation is to be penalized. From the rear, the legs extend straight down from the hip through the hock to the feet. Dewclaws must be removed.

Coat

Pattern—The adult coat is highly characteristic and must include several distinct lengths growing naturally in a specific pattern. The coat is short on the face, ears, front of the forelegs and on the hocks; it is medium length on the body, and longer in the ruff, cape, jabot and culottes. The ruff begins in back of the ears and extends completely around the neck; the cape forms an additional distinct layer extending beyond the ruff; the jabot extends across the chest and down between the front legs. The hair down the middle of the back, starting just behind the cape and continuing over the rump, lies flat. It is slightly shorter than the cape but longer than the hair on the sides of the body and sides of the legs. The coat on the rear of the thighs forms culottes, which should be as long as the ruff. Lack of differentiation in coat lengths should be heavily penalized, as it is an essential breed characteristic.

Schipperke Breed Standard (AKC) (con't)

Texture—The coat is abundant, straight and slightly harsh to the touch. The softer undercoat is dense and short on the body and is very dense around the neck, making the ruff stand out. Silky coats, body coats over three inches in length or very short harsh coats are equally incorrect.

Trimming—As the Schipperke is a natural breed, only trimming of the whiskers and the hair between the pads of the feet is optional. Any other trimming must not be done.

Color

The outer coat must be black. Any color other than a natural black is a disqualification. The undercoat, however, may be slightly lighter. During the shedding period, the coat might take on a transitory reddish cast, which is to be penalized to the degree that it detracts from the overall black appearance of the dog. Graying due to age (seven years or older) or occasional white hairs should not be penalized.

Gait

Proper Schipperke movement is a smooth, well coordinated and graceful trot (basically double tracking at a moderate speed), with a tendency to gradually converge toward the center of balance beneath the dog as speed increases. Front and rear must be in perfect balance with good reach in front and drive in the rear. The topline remains level or slightly sloping downward from the shoulders to the rump. Viewed from the front, the elbows remain close to the body. The legs form a straight line from the shoulders through the elbows to the toes, with the feet pointing straight ahead. From the rear, the legs form a straight line from the hip through the hocks to the pads, with the feet pointing straight ahead.

Temperament

The Schipperke is curious, interested in everything around him, and is an excellent and faithful little watchdog. He is reserved with strangers and ready to protect his family and property if necessary. He displays a confident and independent personality, reflecting the breed's original purpose as watchdog and hunter of vermin.

Disqualifications

A drop ear or ears.

Any color other than a natural black.
