THE BULLETIN ADVERTISING PROCESS

Advertising in the Bulletin is easy and a great way for you to support the SCA. Planning for the next Bulletin issue begins the moment the current issue has been published, so the earlier you notify the Advertising Manager that you are going to advertise the better.

1. Notify the Advertising Manager Jaime Stanchina embraceskips@gmail.com that you wish to place an ad, so that we can allot your ad placement. The earlier you notify us the better. Alternatively, you can go to the SCA Website Bulletin page and pay for your ad up front per the instructions. That will automatically create a notification to the Bulletin to allot your ad space. And then you can contact the Advertising Manager with the ad details.
2. Next, determine what you want the readers to see and learn from this ad (i.e., pictures & verbiage), whether you have a specific theme in mind (i.e., base theme on your dog's name, your kennel name, etc.), or a favourite color, or a color you definitely don't want used in your ad.
3. Select the size ad you want. Remember to make sure the size is appropriate to the amount of content you want to display. Avoid making your ad too busy as that becomes harder to read.
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5. The Advertising Manager will save your ad contents & email on her computer as a back-up copy for the Bulletin and will also forward it to the Editor (Marnie Layng) to have your ad created.
6. The Editor will be in touch with you by email either to clarify what you want if there is a question, or to send you the drafts of the ad for your review and finally for your approval. Drafts will be marked as drafts until final approval is gained. Draft ads are not to be published in any other medium, i.e., FaceBook, other publication, or personal website, etc.
7. After you have approved the final version of your ad for publication in the Bulletin, the Editor will notify the Advertising Manager to send you an invoice if the ad has not been paid for already.
8. Once the ad invoice has been paid the Advertising Manager will send the advertiser a receipt and the Editor will remove the word/s "draft" from the ad and place it in the Bulletin. ***No advertising will be published until payment has been received by the SCA!***
9. Following the publication of the Bulletin, the Editor will send each advertiser a final copy of their ad to be used as they wish.
10. If you plan on creating your own ad, please follow all the same steps as above, but instead of sending the content and details, just send your final ad copy. Be sure to adhere to the proper dimensions for the ad size you wish to use. For best results please send your ad in jpeg format, or as a Word document. Check with the Advertising Manager if you have questions in that regard.

AKC Farm Dog Test

The AKC rolled out the Farm Dog Certified (FDC) test on June 6, 2016. It is similar to the Canine Good Citizen (CGC) program released in 1989. I think of the FDC as a CGC for the country cousin. Where the CGC has ten test behaviors that demonstrate good manners, the FDC has a series of twelve exercises that are typical for a farm. Dogs remain on leash for both CGC and FDC.

Section 1. Purpose The FDC Test is designed to assess the overall conduct of a dog in a typical farm environment. The dog must demonstrate self-control when exposed to livestock and other unique sights, sounds and scents. The dog must exhibit confidence and a willingness to comply with instructions when confronted with a variety of situations. *Chapter VIII Farm Dog Certified (FDC) Test Regulations*

The test is a non-competitive pass/fail evaluation designed to assess the overall conduct of a dog. The dog remains confident and willing to work within farm type surroundings. Dogs may retake each exercise twice before being determined to need additional training to pass. They must pass all of the exercises. The FDC test is open to all dogs at least nine months of age that are AKC registered or listed.



Taking the Test There were seven Schipperkes at SchaSam Farm on May 2, 2021 for the Farm Dog test.

7 Farm Schips

Deb Bruner had her three boys (Blitzen, Ace and Peeps) and I had my four girls (Gracie, Missy, Glory and Jenny). Our dogs ranged in age from under three years old to over thirteen. Dogs must pass twice under two different judges to earn their FDC title. There was a test in the morning and one in the afternoon.

Following the signs The twelve exercises may be designed in any sequence with the exception of the first and last activities. All tests must begin with greeting the judge (for initial dog appraisal) and end with the physical examination by the handler. Throughout the evaluation, the dog must demonstrate self-control while on a loose leash.

Owner of SchaSam Farm and afternoon judge, Marilyn "Sam" Lietz, posted station markers with activity and criteria. Our pattern: greet the judge, noise distraction, supervised separation, reaction to another dog, walk by farm animals, approach livestock, handler feeds livestock, pass through gate, walk over unusual surfaces, walk around farm equipment and past stranger into barn, and jump onto bale for physical examination.

The livestock on the farm consists of ten Nigerian Dwarf goats and an elderly horse with a larger goat in a separate pasture. The neighborhood peacock, Steve, appears at will on the barn roof. The goats are accustomed to people and dogs. They quickly determined that additional hay was available at a new location near the fence. A few stayed very close by for extra servings.

Greeting the judge on a loose leash was not easy for our dogs. They knew both judges and wanted to

greet them as friends. Gentle reminders to meet people politely reduced their enthusiasm. Fortunately, sniffing is not faulted because that's what dogs do.



The Main Attraction

While in the same area, Lizzy walked **another dog** back and forth. In the morning, that dog was Bling, resident Border collie. Jenny's first reaction to seeing Bling was to say hi and step out to greet her. Jenny remained sitting during her retest. In the afternoon test, resident Rat Terrier Dance was working.

Next we **walked by the goats**. Sam's goats are named after Disney and Loony Tune characters such as Bugs, Elmer, Fudd, Daffy, Donald, Taz to name a few. This initial path was about 30 feet away. To get a better view, dogs **approach the livestock**. As I stated, the goats were expecting more hay and stood close to the fence. When Glory reached the fence, a goat put his nose through the wire. They were muzzle to muzzle. The judge next instructed me to go to the end of my leash and recall her to me. The dog must comply and willingly return without tugging. She looked longingly at her new friend, turned and trotted to me. Good girl!

While the **handler feeds livestock**, the dog is tethered about 30' away. The handler tells the dog to stay and proceeds to complete the chore of feeding the animals before returning to the dog. This was a simple activity since the dogs could watch my every move.

Passing through a gate had several parts. The dog is instructed to stay in position (stand, sit or down). The handler opens the gate away from the dog, passes through and calls the dog through the gateway. The handler then instructs the dog to stay as the gate is closed. My girls are trained to wait for a release before going through an opening, so again, it was an easy station.

Walking over unusual surfaces was challenging for 13-year-old

The **noise distraction** was Lizzy (helper extraordinaire) hammering nails on the building followed by starting up the riding lawn mower. None of our dogs had a strong reaction. Although I am sure, Gracie didn't hear most of it.

For **supervised separation**, dogs were left in an x-pen and the handler walked out of sight for a one minute. This test was Jenny's undoing in the morning. She scratched frantically at the door the first time. We retried. She was calmer but still did not pass. By the afternoon test, she whined softly a couple of times and accepted her fate. She passed.

Gracie due to her fussed right wrist. She willingly walked on all three surfaces; I simply adjusted my pace to accommodate her needs. Required surfaces are a tarp and sheet of plywood, each 8 feet long. Our third surface was chain link gate on the grass, although mud, water or logs are acceptable.

Next, we perform a **walking pattern around farm** meandered by equipment, past Lizzy (the passive stranger sitting by the door) and into the barn. Once in the barn we walked up and down the aisle past stalls to the straw pile. The goats were bleating in their stall when Peeps (Deb's youngest) walked by. They proved to be far too stimulating and with a repeatedly tight leash, he failed in the afternoon test.



Once in the straw room, the dog **jumps up on a bale**. The dog may stand, sit or down until the Judge instructs the handler to allow the dog to

jump off the bale. The Judge determines length of stay (minimum of 10 seconds) until satisfied that the dog is comfortable with the exercise. Gracie hesitated. I showed her another bale and she jumped up. I think it was the lighting.



While on the bale, we performed the **physical examination**. Briefly inspecting the dog's ears, eyes, mouth, coat and toes to ensure the dog is free of any foreign material such as grass, hay, burrs, etc. Once completed, the judge gave Farm Dog Test qualifying rosettes. After fourteen tests, our seven dogs had twelve qualifying scores and earned five Farm Dog titles. The two youngsters (Peeps and Jenny) will take another Farm Dog Test in a few months. Gracie, Missy and Glory have earned their CGCA's. Jenny is preparing for her CGC this summer. If you find a Farm Dog Test in your area, I urge you to attend. It is fun to spend a day on the farm and our city dogs can strut their stuff with their country cousins.

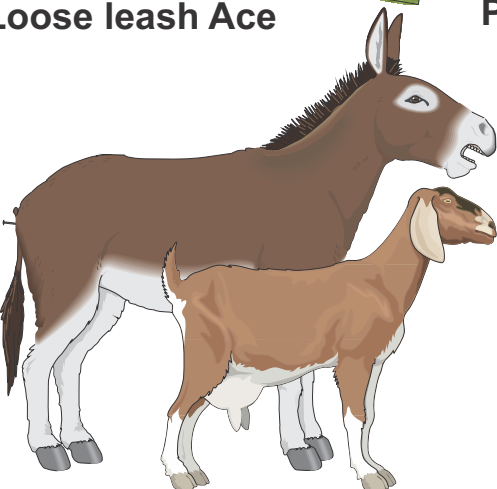

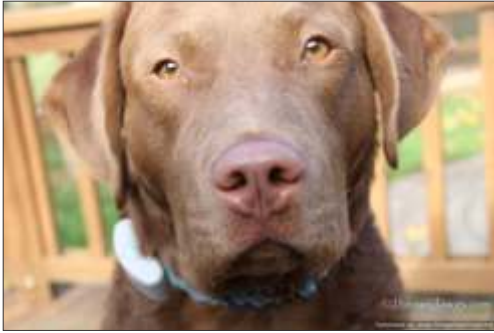

Canine Health Screening - The Eye Exam

I am continuing my canine health screening series with the eye screening exam (sometimes referred to as a CERF exam).

“Freighter”

What Is The Purpose Of The Eye Exam And How Is It Done?

The eye exam is a screening exam that provides a breeder with information about whether a dog may have inheritable eye diseases. This allows the breeder to make informed breeding decisions.

The exam is performed by board certified (ACVO) veterinary ophthalmologists. The dog's eyes are dilated and the exam is performed using indirect ophthalmoscopy and slit lamp biomicroscopy.

It is not a comprehensive ocular health examination, but rather an eye screening exam. The ophthalmologist is looking for specific genetic disorders that frequently result in blindness. If any of these disorders are present, the recommendation is against breeding that dog.

What Are The Disorders For Which There Is A Recommendation Against Breeding In All Breeds?

1. **Keratoconjunctivitis sicca (KCS)** – Breeding is not recommended for any animal demonstrating keratitis consistent with KCS. The prudent approach is to assume KCS to be hereditary except in cases suspected to be non-genetic in origin.
2. **Cataract** – Breeding is not recommended for any animal demonstrating partial or complete opacity of the lens or its capsule ***unless the examiner has also checked the space for “significance of above cataract unknown” or unless specified otherwise for the particular breed.***
3. **Lens luxation or subluxation.**
4. **Glaucoma.**
5. **Persistent hyperplastic primary vitreous (PHPV)**
6. **Retinal detachment.**
7. **Retinal dysplasia – geographic or detached forms.**
8. **Optic nerve coloboma.**
9. **Optic nerve hypoplasia.**
10. **Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA)** – Breeding is not advised for any animal demonstrating bilaterally symmetric retinal degeneration (considered to be PRA unless proven otherwise).

**Note: The prudent approach is to assume these disorders are hereditary except in cases specifically known to be associated with trauma, other causes of ocular inflammation, specific metabolic diseases or nutritional deficiencies.*

Canine Health Screening - The Eye Exam

Dogs with these disorders are not eligible for an Eye Registry Certification Number and the recommendation is that they should not be bred. [Source](#)

How Does A Dog Receive A Certification Number?

A dog with a normal test result will receive an Eye Registry Certification Number. There are also several conditions which may be noted as “breeder option”. It is suspected these conditions are hereditary, but they won't normally compromise vision. The dog is technically “passed” and will receive an Eye Registry Certification Number with the condition noted. It is the breeder's option whether to use the dog as part of their breeding program. A list of the “breeder option” conditions can be found [here](#).

The exam result is valid for one year and should be repeated prior to breeding if the exam is more than a year old.

What Is The Difference Between Eye CERF And OFA Eye Registry Certification?

Both [CERF](#) and [OFA](#) maintain eye registries of test results. The tests are the same and they are both conducted by board certified (ACVO) veterinary ophthalmologists. The forms the doctors use to record their exam results are different, but both registries will accept the other registry's form. It is the breeder's option which registry to use.

How Should A Puppy Buyer Use This Information?

Eye exams are one of the least expensive health screening exams. Many dog shows offer clinics where the exam is priced at \$35 or \$40 per dog. Most are first come first served during the clinic hours and are usually offered on multiple days.

The test is quick and painless for the dog but the results can alert breeders and puppy buyers to hereditary conditions present in the parents which may affect the puppy's vision. Puppy buyers should ask for a copy of the sire and dam's (dad and mom's) registration and verify a normal result, or if not normal, a breeder option result. Puppy buyers can also verify the sire and dam's test results through one of the public registries, either the [CERF](#) or [OFA](#) registries. Puppy buyer's should also verify that test result is current, (within a year of the breeding).

The Eye Exam—One Pup's Experience

Freighter had his eyes examined at the show he attended this past January. We paid the fee and then drops were put in his eyes to dilate them. While we were waiting for his eyes to dilate, we filled out his paperwork.

It is necessary to bring all pertinent information and numbers along to the exam, including the dog's AKC registration number and microchip number, if any. Once the paperwork was completed, the clinic workers verified Freighter's microchip number by scanning it. Then we waited for our turn.

The exam is conducted in a darkened room. The dog should hold still which can be a bit tricky since the ophthalmologist uses an unusual looking piece of equipment to look in the dog's eyes. Most vets are used to dogs who are uneasy so they go slowly.

Freighter can be one of the wiggly pups, but eventually the vet was able to finish the exam. His eyes were normal. This is actually his second exam. He had his first eye exam in January 2013 and also received a normal result.

How did you start in Schips? - first Schip? first experience with the breed?

My mother, Connie Gerstner Miller who was already a top Golden Retriever breeder and professional handler wanted a small, companion dog to travel with her. She went to Fran Griggs of Skipalong and purchased a male puppy, "Luvalot". Luv became a National Specialty Best of Breed winner, Multiple Best In Show winner and ROM producer. I was 5 years old when he came to us, and I lost him when I was 21. I was able to show him in Junior Showmanship some, and see him win his last Best In Show in 1983 when he was 11 years old.

I continued on to breed not only Schipperkes with the Malagold name, but top winning English Cocker Spaniels, as well as generations of Malagold Golden Retrievers. I participated in Junior Showmanship and went on to become a professional handler for many years.

What do you love about the breed?

EVERYTHING! But seriously, I love the size (compared to having a bunch of Goldens), I also love their loyalty, curiosity, the ability to have a pack, ease of grooming, and having my own security guards.

If involved in sports or conformation with your Schips, please describe your involvement.

I have been mostly involved in conformation. I have completed one CD degree, and I am currently working with my puppy, Tug in obedience, and would like to get his CGC certificate so that he can visit assisted living / memory care patients.

Any exciting recent brags?

Because of COVID, there hasn't been anything in 2020 / 2021. The most recent is Bikini's record. She finished with points in 6 shows, with 3 majors and 4 sets of points at specialties or supported entries. She also won an Award of Merit from the classes. The day after she finished her Championship at the Southern Michigan Schipperke Club, she was moved up for the supported entry the next day and won Best of Breed over 9 other specials. Bikini has only been shown 3 times since, all at specialties or supported entries, where she has earned 2 Best of Opposite awards and one AOM. She has racked up 20 points (all majors) towards her Grand in 4 shows. I am very proud that she won every point and award as a special under judges I had never had the pleasure of showing under before! But I am most proud that she was recognized as a Top 20 contender for 2019!

What is your most memorable Schip moment?

There are too many to name, for sure. A few worth mentioning are:

- Winning (3) Winner's Bitch awards at National Specialties with Ch. Malagold Baby Grand (from Bred-By in 1992), Ch. Malagold Sand Dab De Lamer (from 12-18 in 2004) and Ch. Malagold Fun In The Sun DeLamer (from 6-9 in 2006)
- Winning a huge group at Wisconsin Kennel Club in 1993 with Ch. Malagold's Jack's Navoo of JB
- Winning Best of Breed at Westminster with Ch. Malagold Star Evol Boweebol in 1994
- Winning 2 AOM's at National Specialties with Ch. Malagold Star Evol Boweebol in 1995 & 1996
- Winning a Group 1 with my 6 month old puppy, Ch. Malagold's Jujube, who was a Weebols daughter in 1993
- Best Veteran and AOM at Illiniana Schipperke Club with Malagold One Oh One In The Sun in 2018. He was never finished when he was young because he really didn't like showing. He showed his heart out that day...

Any additional remarks / stories you would like to share?

I am very thankful that I was able to start my journey in Schipperke's with a dog like Luvalot from a breeder like Fran Griggs. Fran was always extremely kind and was always willing to share her knowledge with me. Luvalot certainly taught me what a Schipperke should be! Since then, I have had lulls in my breeding program because of moves, jobs and children. I am very thankful for Krista Nuovo Roe and June Moore for entrusting me with dogs from their breeding programs for me to show and continue my program with.

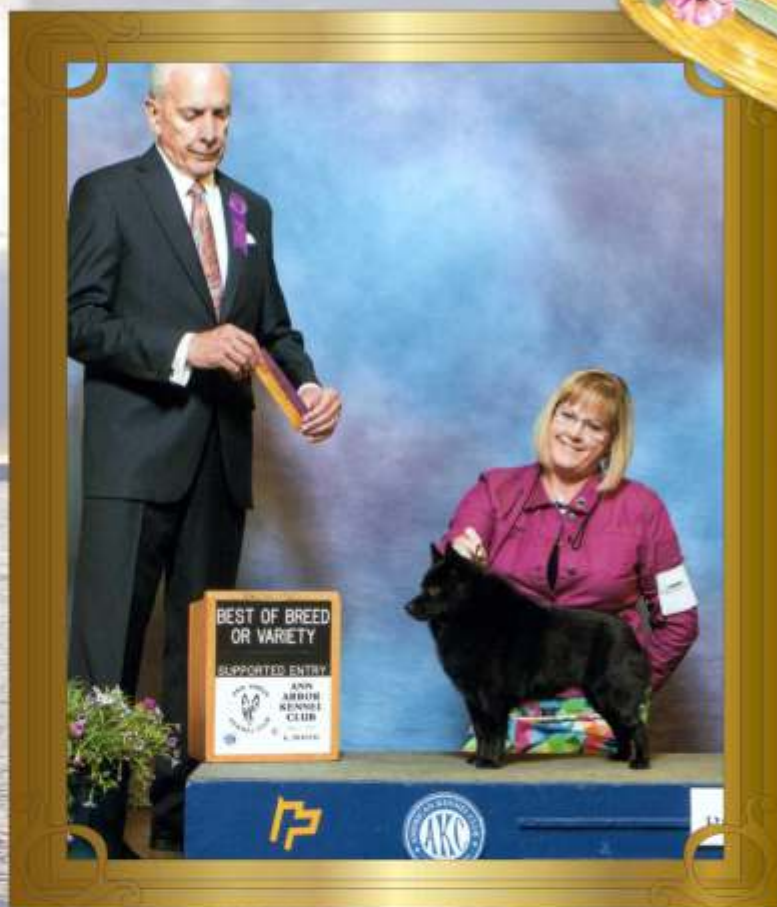

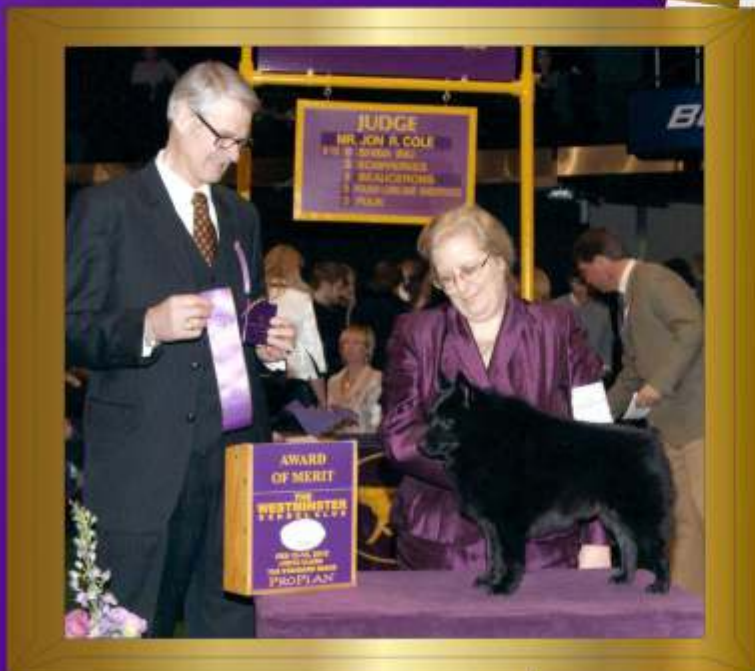

5 Keys To Successfully Teaching Dog Tricks

I like to help Dog Parents find unique ways to do things that will save time & money — so I write about “outside the box” Dog Tips and Dog Hacks that most wouldn't think of. I'm a lifelong dog owner — currently have 2 mixed breed Golden Aussies that we found abandoned on the side of the road as puppies. I've always trained my own dogs and help friends train theirs, as well. Professionally, I worked at a vet and have several friends who are veterinarians — whom I consult with regularly. (And just because I love animals so much, I also worked at a Zoo for awhile!) I've been sharing my best ideas with others by blogging full-time since 1998 (the same year that Google started... and before the days of Facebook and YouTube). My daily motivation is to help first-time dog owners be better prepared from the first day your new puppy enters your home. I like to help dog owners understand what's 'normal' and what you can expect in terms of living with and training your dog — how to get through the ups & downs of potty training, chewing, teaching commands, getting your dog to listen, and everything else that takes place during that hectic first year! When I'm not training, walking, grooming, or making homemade treats for my dogs, you will find me at the corner of Good News & Fun Times as publisher of The Fun Times Guide (32 fun & helpful websites). To date, I've written over 600 articles for dog owners on this site! Many of them have upwards of 200K shares

No matter which particular dog trick you're working on, teaching dog tricks requires these 5 things every single time:

TIP #1: [Eye contact is a must](#) because you need to have your dog's full attention.

It's critical that you have your dog's full attention throughout the entire training process — no matter how short or how long it may be. As soon as your dog gets tired, becomes disinterested, or stops looking at you, then it's time to quit the training session and come back to it the very next day.

Research conducted at the University of Florida focused on the role of eye contact and facial cues in influencing canine behavior. Earlier studies have suggested that dogs seem to know when they are being watched and even wait to perform forbidden behavior like digging in the garden when they know their owners aren't looking. TIP #2: [Start with a handful of treats](#) (...or a pocketful, or a bag full).

I highly recommend [Biljac frozen dog food \(thawed\)](#) or [Biljac liver treats](#) (non-frozen). They're both soft and pliable in your hands and extra meaty to your dog! Plus, they're small, pellet-sized pieces — so your dog won't have to spend much time chewing and he won't get full during the training process.

Once he has finished his treats, let your dog go back to whatever he was doing before you gave the command. This is very important. One reason many dogs fail to come when they are called, is that the word “come” becomes a signal that their fun is about to end. For example, when you call your dog inside before you leave for work, your dog knows that it means playtime is over. Avoid letting him make this connection by allowing him to go back to whatever he was doing before you

began to practice [this new dog trick]. This makes it doubly rewarding – he gets treats and he gets to go back to his fun. [Source](#)

TIP #3: [Decide which word or phrase you are going to assign to this new dog trick.](#)

The easiest dog trick ever is to start with [some behavior that your dog already does](#) on his own, and just give it a name. Because then it becomes a dog trick *that can be done on command!* Be sure to choose a word (or phrase) that will sound appropriate in public and that rolls off your tongue easily. Here are some more tips for [choosing the best words or commands](#) for dog tricks.

Part of training is teaching a dog to perform a certain behavior and another part is teaching them to do it on cue. If your dog already exhibits the behavior, then all you have to do is put that behavior on cue. And that's another reason I like teaching dogs to do tricks—it's often half done before I even start! [Source](#)

TIP #4: [Set things up so that your dog will succeed every time he attempts a new trick.](#)

That means, once you say the command for this new trick, you want it to be easy enough that your dog can do it — even in a small way. Every little step in the right direction deserves a huge amount of praise and a reward. Never set your dog up to fail — which means don't make things too difficult for him, especially in the beginning. You want him to succeed every single time you ask him to do something.

Set your dog up to succeed. If your dog isn't getting it, the behavior probably needs to be broken down into smaller steps. [Source](#)

TIP #5: [Reward your dog immediately for even the smallest successes.](#)

Rewarding your dog serves as positive reinforcement that he has done something that you approve of. The best type of reward is to simply display huge amounts of praise and excitement while hugging your dog — because your dog gets important cues from your own emotions and behaviors. In addition, you should use treats in order to connect that praise with something that your dog likes best: his favorite treats. You may also want to [use a clicker](#) to provide immediate reinforcement when you're training your dog to do new tricks.

In simple dog training terms, positive reinforcement means that you give your dog a reward when he does a behavior you like, which has the effect of strengthening (or increasing the rate of) that behavior. For instance, if a dog sits and then you promptly give him a food treat, he will be more likely to sit again, hoping to earn another food treat. Remember... positive reinforcement makes a behavior more likely to occur again.

In Summary

Every time you want to teach your dog a new trick, you should go through the above steps up to 10 times in a row (or until it becomes difficult for you to find success in your dog's actions).

Then, let your dog play or do something that he thoroughly enjoys. That way, his mind is completely off the process of learning a new dog trick.

Finally, repeat the entire process again within 24 hours. Continue for several days in a row until it is clear that your dog has definitely learned this new trick and whenever you mention the command word, he knows precisely what it means. Consistency is the key when teaching dog tricks!

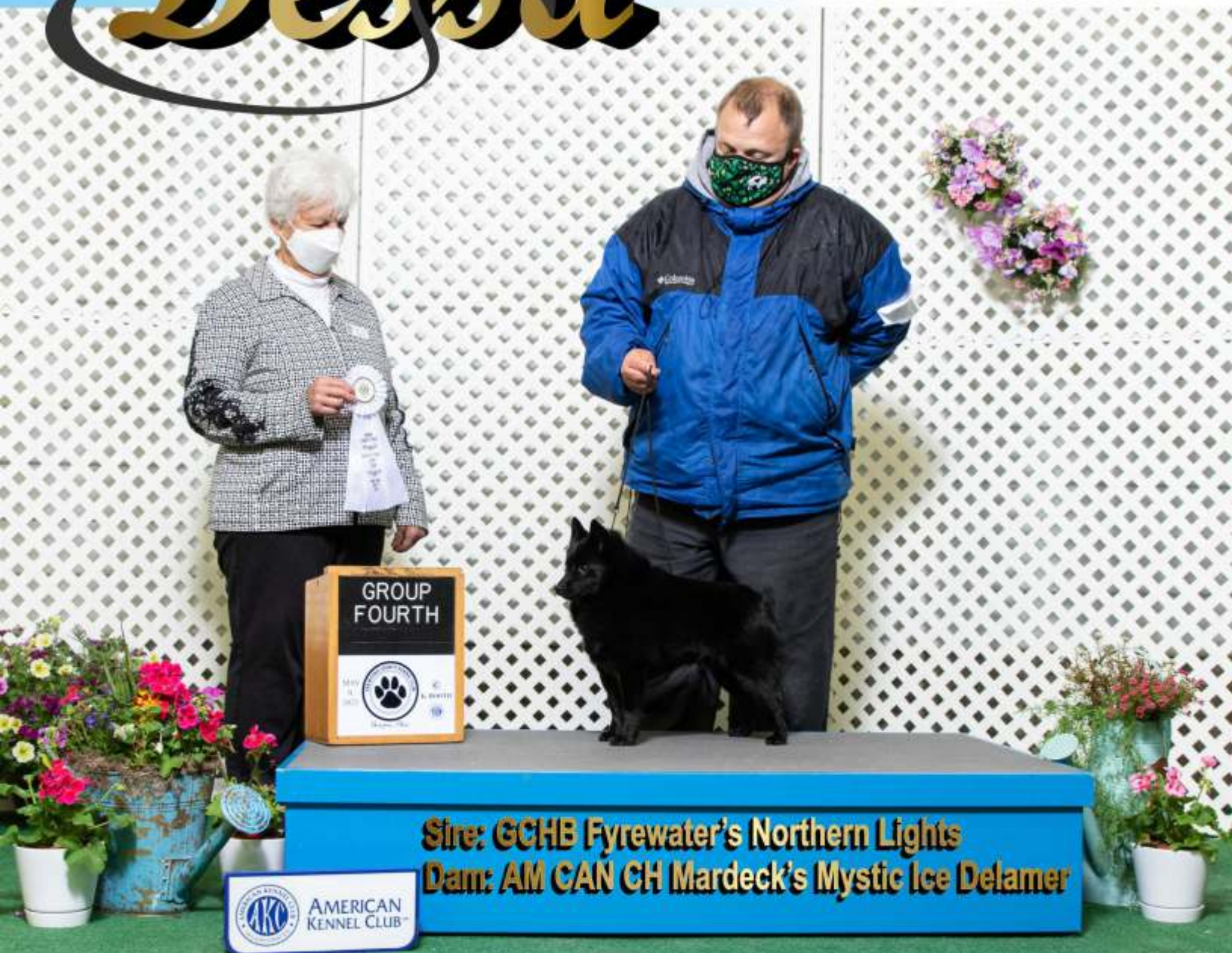

Schipperke Breed Standard (AKC)

General Appearance

The Schipperke is an agile, active watchdog and hunter of vermin. In appearance he is a small, thickset, cobby, black, tailless dog, with a fox-like face. The dog is square in profile and possesses a distinctive coat, which includes a stand-out ruff, cape and culottes. All of these create a unique silhouette, appearing to slope from shoulders to croup. Males are decidedly masculine without coarseness. Bitches are decidedly feminine without over refinement. Any deviation from the ideal described in the standard should be penalized to the extent of the deviation. Faults common to all breeds are as undesirable in the Schipperke as in any other breed, even though such faults may not be specifically mentioned in the standard.

Size, Proportion, Substance

Size—The suggested height at the highest point of the withers is 11-13 inches for males and 10-12 inches for bitches. Quality should always take precedence over size. **Proportion**—Square in profile. **Substance**—Thickset.

Head

Expression—The expression is questioning, mischievous, impudent and alert, but never mean or wild. The well proportioned head, accompanied by the correct eyes and ears, will give the dog proper Schipperke expression.

Skull—The skull is of medium width, narrowing toward the muzzle. Seen in profile with the ears laid back, the skull is slightly rounded. The upper jaw is moderately filled in under the eyes, so that, when viewed from above, the head forms a wedge tapering smoothly from the back of the skull to the tip of the nose. The stop is definite but not prominent. The length of the muzzle is slightly less than the length of the skull.

Eyes—The ideal eyes are small, oval rather than round, dark brown, and placed forward on the head.

Ears—The ears are small, triangular, placed high on the head, and, when at attention, very erect. A drop ear or ears is a disqualification.

Nose—The nose is small and black.

Bite—The bite must be scissors or level. Any deviation is to be severely penalized.

Neck, Topline, Body

Neck—The neck is of moderate length, slightly arched and in balance with the rest of the dog to give the correct silhouette. **Topline**—The topline is level or sloping slightly from the withers to the croup. The stand-out ruff adds to the slope, making the dog seem slightly higher at the shoulders than at the rump. **Body**—The chest is broad and deep, and reaches to the elbows. The well sprung ribs (modified oval) are wide behind the shoulders and taper to the sternum. The forechest extends in front of the shoulders between the front legs. The loin is short, muscular and moderately drawn up. The croup is broad and well-rounded with the tail docked. No tail is visually discernible.

Forequarters

The shoulders are well laid back, with the legs extending straight down from the body when viewed from the front. From the side, legs are placed well under the body. Pasterns are short, thick and strong, but still flexible, showing a slight angle when viewed from the side. Dewclaws are generally removed. Feet are small, round and tight. Nails are short, strong and black.

Hindquarters

The hindquarters appear slightly lighter than the forequarters, but are well muscled, and in balance with the front. The hocks are well let down and the stifles are well bent. Extreme angulation is to be penalized. From the rear, the legs extend straight down from the hip through the hock to the feet. Dewclaws must be removed.

Coat

Pattern—The adult coat is highly characteristic and must include several distinct lengths growing naturally in a specific pattern. The coat is short on the face, ears, front of the forelegs and on the hocks; it is medium length on the body, and longer in the ruff, cape, jabot and culottes. The ruff begins in back of the ears and extends completely around the neck; the cape forms an additional distinct layer extending beyond the ruff; the jabot extends across the chest and down between the front legs. The hair down the middle of the back, starting just behind the cape and continuing over the rump, lies flat. It is slightly shorter than the cape but longer than the hair on the sides of the body and sides of the legs. The coat on the rear of the thighs forms culottes, which should be as long as the ruff. Lack of differentiation in coat lengths should be heavily penalized, as it is an essential breed characteristic.

Schipperke Breed Standard (AKC) (con't)

Texture—The coat is abundant, straight and slightly harsh to the touch. The softer undercoat is dense and short on the body and is very dense around the neck, making the ruff stand out. Silky coats, body coats over three inches in length or very short harsh coats are equally incorrect.

Trimming—As the Schipperke is a natural breed, only trimming of the whiskers and the hair between the pads of the feet is optional. Any other trimming must not be done.

Color

The outer coat must be black. Any color other than a natural black is a disqualification. The undercoat, however, may be slightly lighter. During the shedding period, the coat might take on a transitory reddish cast, which is to be penalized to the degree that it detracts from the overall black appearance of the dog. Graying due to age (seven years or older) or occasional white hairs should not be penalized.

Gait

Proper Schipperke movement is a smooth, well coordinated and graceful trot (basically double tracking at a moderate speed), with a tendency to gradually converge toward the center of balance beneath the dog as speed increases. Front and rear must be in perfect balance with good reach in front and drive in the rear. The topline remains level or slightly sloping downward from the shoulders to the rump. Viewed from the front, the elbows remain close to the body. The legs form a straight line from the shoulders through the elbows to the toes, with the feet pointing straight ahead. From the rear, the legs form a straight line from the hip through the hocks to the pads, with the feet pointing straight ahead.

Temperament

The Schipperke is curious, interested in everything around him, and is an excellent and faithful little watchdog. He is reserved with strangers and ready to protect his family and property if necessary. He displays a confident and independent personality, reflecting the breed's original purpose as watchdog and hunter of vermin.

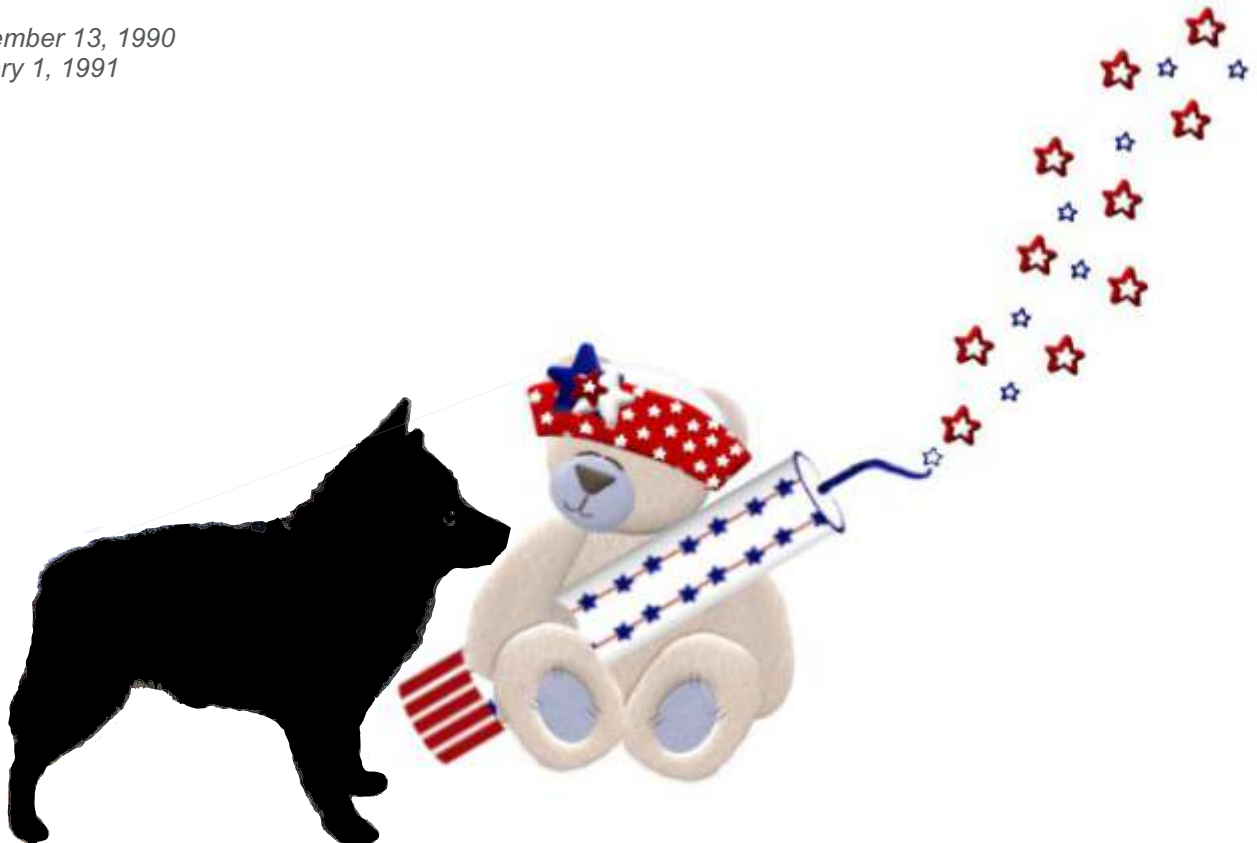
