BREEDERS FORUM

For this edition of the Breeders Forum, folks who compete in various performance activities were asked how they choose a puppy. The folks who responded compete in all kinds of activities, from Rally, Obedience, Agility, NASDA, Scent Work, Fast Cat, Weight Pull, you name it. - Deb Bruner

Joe Sangenito

First and foremost, I look for an outgoing personality. A puppy with no fear and a lot of energy. The one that's going to be a handful and keep you on your toes. I've been fortunate in that the breeder of my last 2 dogs allowed me to interact with the puppies and pick the one I thought would be best suited for agility. Getting on the floor and playing with them really helped reveal their personalities. The ones I chose were the most rambunctious and vocal of their litters. Watching them run and play can also provide some insight but it's difficult to assess their athleticism as most puppies move awkwardly at that young age.

Kathy Sweet

What do I look for in a puppy. Great question. Since I am pretty much an obedience person, and have been for almost 50 years and have had different breeds (Lab, Flat-Coated Retrievers, Brittanys, Schipperke and Poodle), here is my take on this subject.

The first thing I look for is structure. Yes, believe it or not, if the dog is not put together well it will not hold up to do obedience. When I get a dog, my goal is a long term (hopefully 10 years or more) partner. So, structure is very important to me. I go and watch the breed I am interested in at dog shows, and find the dog/s that I think are put together and move well. I then will go and talk to the person showing the dog. Most of the time for the breeds that I am interested in there are no obedience titled parents. My choice. I have found that many times these people think I am crazy for wanting to do this with the chosen breed. I have been told some crazy things!! Like, they can't do that!! Or you are crazy for wanting to do that with this breed. Like I said, my choice. I have never been a person who works some of the more common obedience breeds. Again, my choice. I like a breed that is relatively high energy. There have been some breeders who chose to not work with me, that is fine. My requirements are: male (only like the boys), not a single puppy, raised by mom (not humans), and I want the puppy at 8 weeks of age. There are a lot of breeders out there who will not sell you a puppy until they are 3, 4 or sometimes 6 months old. Sorry, doesn't work for me. I need to put a lot of work into a young puppy. They need to learn how to learn at a young age.

In today's technological world, it is wonderful to be able to see the puppies grow up. I like to see video's (if litter is not local) of puppies at least weekly from the time they are 2-3 weeks old. If local, I will go and play with puppies weekly. I look for how they interact with the other puppies in the litter, as well as how they interact with people. I want the puppy that is outgoing, has good structure and movement. I lean towards the puppy that would rather play with people as opposed to the other puppies. Forty-nine day old puppies, it has been shown by many studies, is one of the best times to temperament test them. This is not always possible, but I do like to at least see a video of them at this time. I know that some things change on a puppy on a day to day basis, but if the breeder has any experience at all, they know each puppy very well and can tell you who that puppy is. It is usually the one they want to keep. That is the biggest problem when I am choosing a puppy. I have explained this to any breeder that I work with from the very start, so hopefully we can work it out. I am more than willing to show the dog in the breed ring for a Championship if that is something the breeder wants. Some of my thoughts on choosing a puppy.

Kathy Swan

I've owned Schipperkes for over 21 years. My Schips have earned over 700 sporting titles in many activities plus good citizen, temperament, farm dog and other certificates. They also have 110 agility championships in four venues. I bred five of the nine Schipperkes that I've competed with. We've done agility, Barn Hunt, coursing, FAST CAT, NASDA, Nose Work, obedience, Parkour, rally, Treibball, tricks and weight pull.

When selecting a puppy to buy or keep, I want a confident pup most of all. Spending a lifetime cheerleading a dog is very draining for both individuals. This independence is tempered with their desire to be with me and play together. I competed in different sports with littermate sisters. Not all dogs want to play the same sports. I try multiple activities to see which ones the dog really likes. Most are willing to play anything with me. I look for an extra spark during the game.

The dog's conformation must be correct. Their legs, shoulders, hips and back are critical to performance. Function follows form. Size isn't as important to me as long as the dog is balanced. My dogs have all been on the larger size: the girls are all 12' and over and the males 13" plus. Health tested parents is an expected requirement.

Having an on and off switch is more difficult to see in a young pup (I like to bring mine home at 8 weeks if not born here). The ability to settle is very important in both sports and at home. Often dogs that are promoted as being good agility prospects are simply out of control. My dogs must also live nicely together. I've kept from four to six Schips for the past 16 years with peaceful coexistence.

Sheryl Meyer

1. Overall the pup needs to be structurally sound.
2. A good strong back end. Since the speed and drive power come from the back side, I like a little stronger back side.
3. I also think the rear should be slightly higher. I know especially with schipps conformation does not want a little higher back end, but that goes with a stronger back end in my opinion for better performance.
4. I also wanted the most spunky, independent dog of the litter. I want the most confident dog I can get. I want the dog that can be by themselves and doesn't have to stay right with the pack. I want the "alpha" in the litter. I like the little stubborn LBD's.
5. Finally, looking for strong toy drive, tugging, chasing, etc.

Deb Bruner

For me, choosing a pup for performance involves many things, including structure, temperament, toy play, confidence, and curiosity. But before even looking at pups, I have considered the breeder and the type of Schips that breeder produces. Granted, as I've gained experience over the years my criteria regarding breeders and puppies has evolved, but first and foremost I want to see Schips with great temperament, health testing, and I want Schips raised in the home.

Meeting the dam and sire of the pups is helpful in evaluating a pup for performance: I like to see "parents" with the same qualities I'm looking for in a pup. I want an outgoing pup, one who likes to engage with me; I do not want a wallflower or a pup who seems easily startled. As mentioned above, I also want the pup to be raised in a home environment and not in a separate building or kennel. Pups need to be exposed to lots of attention and home sounds; again, I want to see a desire to bond with humans and a pup who is more curious about sudden noises as opposed to being fearful of them. Being raised in a home environment is best for preparing the pup for life's surprises.

Taking a pup between 8-10 weeks old is ideal. I know a number of breeders like to hang onto pups much later than this to see how they develop for the show ring, and I also have been told by some breeders that they feel giving a pup up before all the vaccines are given is “risky.” For me, the longer a pup spends with a breeder, the less time I have to start teaching that pup games with an eye for things like agility and for building teamwork. The puppy socialization window is short and many behaviorists have stated it starts to close at around 16 weeks if not earlier. I'm happy that my vets recognize that (many older vets do not, I have noticed.) I strive to get my pup “out and about” (safely, of course, until fully vaccinated) and exposed to everything I can think of to lay the foundation for things like noisy trial environments or shows. The older the pup, the more likely I may encounter some issues I may want to untrain/retrain, which is far more difficult than working with a blank slate, so-to-speak.

I have been offered – and in some cases taken – dogs as old as three years old and put them in agility training and it's a double-edged sword: while the adult dog can begin working on jumps and equipment right away, the adult attitude can be a challenge to shape. With a puppy I can shape the attitude as I see fit and I don't have to deal with any mental baggage that may come with an adult.

Schipperkes are not difficult to train, contrary to what some breeders say. Again, it goes back to working with a pup at an early age to shape the behaviors a person wants. If a Schip, or any dog for that matter, is left to its own devices, then yes, you may encounter attitudes that are not conducive to learning and training, so I go back to emphasizing working with pups from an early age.

Tails provide balance in addition to communication with humans and other dogs. Now that I have a pup with a tail, it's SO much easier to gauge how my pup is feeling. Without a tail, a person has to rely on attitude and perhaps some facial expressions which is far more challenging. Leaving dewclaws on also helps with balance. My rehab vet has told me that tail docking and dewclaw removal not only create trauma in the moment but very likely long-lasting nerve pain.

When Kathy Swan raised the puppies from a breeding we did (Jenny x Cannoli), Kathy followed the Puppy Culture protocol and as a result all four pups are ideally suited to anything we may want to venture into with them. Puppy Culture is a phenomenal puppy-raising program and I would love to see more breeders invest in it.

NASDA: Two-Years Later

My original article appeared in the Fall 2021 Bulletin. In it, I shared the experience of the first North American Sport Dog Association (NASDA) trial held in Washington State. A lot has changed since that August weekend. The organization has grown as have the number of Schipperkes competing.

More Clubs, Judges & Trials

As of December 31, 2023, there are 94 clubs in 29 states plus 21 clubs in five Canadian provinces. Most clubs are approved and several are still provisional. Here in Washington State, we have grown to ten clubs. There are 116 NASDA judges in 25 states plus 22 judges in four Canadian provinces. There are 11 judges in WA State (4 licensed, 2 provincial and 6 apprentice). One judge also judges Barn Hunt; two are also Scent Work judges.

We've had 215 trials in WA since August 2021, with another 40 already scheduled for 2024. Clubs can offer two, three or more trials in a day. This can quickly increase the number of opportunities for teams. A couple western WA clubs hold mid-week and single day weekend trials. One or all classes can be offered in each trial. Clubs aren't required to offer all levels.

A common trial format is to have trials simultaneously. For example, Trailing & Location Level 1 handler would run Judge Mary's course and immediately walk over to Judge Donna for trial 2. Multiple dog/handler teams would be judges at the same time. When all of Level 1 is complete, hides are set for Level 2. In Puppy Aptitude, Level 1 and Level 2 courses, the hide locations are known to the handler. In Level 3 and higher, the hides are blind. Handlers are not allowed to see where the quarry boxes are. This presents a problem for handlers with multiple dogs. Only one reset (moving the boxes to a new location) is done. Exhibitors may use handlers not entered in the class to work their additional dogs.

More Schipperkes

Registrations of Schipperkes have greatly increased. There are 24 Schipperkes registered with NASDA, SCA members own 18 of them and 14 of those live here in western Washington. Nineteen Schips earned a total of 61 titles. Due to our early start in the game, dogs belonging to Deb Bruner, Janet Sutton and I have earned 51 of those titles. The three dogs with the most titles (six) are my girls Glory (Skydance's Olympic Crest Glory) and Missy (Olympic Crest Ain' Misbehavin') plus Deb Bruner's Peeps (Look at Me de Sang Bleu). Janet's Tundra (Blackfire's Thunderball) has five and her Schooner (Sunrise's Bonnie Schooner Harry) has four titles. The other dogs with four titles are Deb's Ace (Willow's My Aim Is True) and Elzee (Memyselfni for Blackfire de Sang Bleu) plus my Jenny (Casablanca JJ Meek Imp) and Julee (Olympic Crest Jubilee). My Gracie (Olympic Crest Amazing Grace) and Deb's Cannoli (Rendezvous With Cannoli de Sang Bleu) each have three titles and her Blitzen (Willow's Who'll Stop the Rain?) has two. Six Schips have no titles. The remaining six dogs have one or two titles. I believe six more titles were earned in January 2024 by our WA dogs, including the first Level 3 title by Peeps (UI3).



More Bonuses

Schipperkes are very well represented in our western Washington trials. We are usually the breed with the most entries (just like the first trial in 2021). Dogs of all sizes compete for the High in Class. Originally, there was only a 10 point High in Class award. Now there are placements. First place is currently 15 extra points, second place is 10 points, third place is 5 and fourth place receives 1 point. There are also Best of Breed bonuses if there are two to four of the same breed in the same class; a 5 point bonus is added. Breeds with five to nine dogs in a class would have the 5 points bonus and 3 points for the second highest scoring. If there are ten or more dogs, a 1 point third place is added. Teams must earn the minimum qualifying score of 20 points in order to receive bonuses. Schooner has been racking up the points with Best of Breed and High in Class in Urban Locating Level 3. He's earning 45 points for those runs.

More titles

NASDA has additional titling options. All classes now have Grand Champion level beyond the Master title. The Master Champion titles exist to test a team's endurance skills. The Grand Championship is elevated higher, and so are the rats, up to 9 feet above the ground.

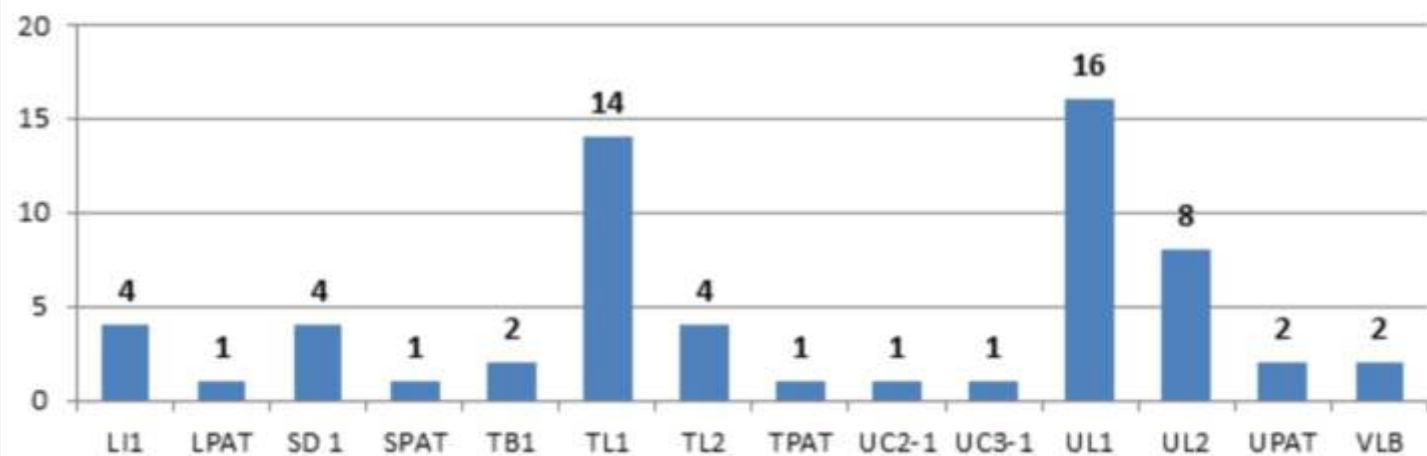
In 2022, Urban Challenge games were added. There are six challenges that involve locating rats in a quarry cage. They are designed to test and challenge handling skills in Urban Locating. They are level 2 or higher in difficulty.

1. Distance –the handler may not step past the start line until a confirmed find.
2. You Make the Call –the handler calls “at” or “lert” when the hide has been found.
3. Elusive Rat –a hide that may be elevated or inaccessible.
4. One or None –an urban search that may have one hide or none.
5. Silence –no talking or mouth sounds after the initial search cue at the start line.
6. Roll of the Dice –a random draw to select which two games are combined.

The following year, similar games were added to Lost Item recovery (distance, you make the call, elusive etc). Both sets Challenge Games have separate titling paths similar to other classes. Earning 100 points in a specific challenge is required to receive a level 1 title. Challenge games have bonuses for placement with 3 or more dogs competing. First place receives 10 points, second is 9 points and so on to tenth place receiving 1 point.

Schips are competing in nearly every class. Urban Location and Trailing and Locating are the most popular classes. Peeps is the only Schip to earn Urban Challenge titles. I'm not aware of any Schips in the Lost Item Challenge games nor have any begun Master level yet. It will only be a matter of time, especially since Peeps finished UL3.

Versatile Level Champion Titles are designed to acknowledge and reward those dogs that are able to successfully compete in Trailing, Urban, and Brace levels. Any dog completing all class titles at each level shall receive a Level Championship title. There are two Schipperke Bronze Champions, my brace team of Glory and Missy.

Puppy Aptitude Tests (PAT) is a fun way to start playing NASDA with a youngster. Puppies over four months and under nine months are eligible for this optional titling level. Dogs 6 months of age or older on the date of the test can start in Level I. I opted to start Julee (Olympic Crest Jubilee) in the PATs. She was four month and a week old when I entered her in the Lost Item and Shed tests. To increase her fun (and the odds of passing), she ran in two trials of each. In Lost Item, puppies are allowed to search for either a handler scented item from the Level I list or a favorite toy. I brought toys. The search area is small (100-300 square feet) and done on leash. The first area was in a garage. Julee was

happily exploring when she hit on a familiar odor, her beloved “kunky” toy! She was so excited to find it in a new place (please note, I’ done no prior training with her). She passed and earned her first title, LPAT. During her second search, when she’ leave the search area (defined with soccer cones), I’ say her name. Since she was also in STAR puppy class, she would come to me and sit. When time was called (one minute is allowed), she was just two feet away from her toy raccoon.

Next was her hunt for an antler. The SPAT search area is much larger 1,500-2,000 square feet with the same one minute search time. As luck would have it, the neighbors turned their goats out just as we approached the search area in the adjacent woods. Julee spent her time watching goat TV, playing with a stick and sniffing moss. We moved to the second search area deeper in the woods. I showed her another antler and we began. This time she found the shed and then played with a stick. Gotta love a puppy enjoyment of life.

Julee was seven months old when she searched for her first rats in UPAT. Since her last hunts, she had graduated from STAR Puppy and earned a Training Level Parkour title. Julee met rats in the summer while visiting SchaSam Farm but hadn’ searched for any. Her first search was among a forest of office furniture on pallets outside. She didn’ hesitate to locate the quarry box within the 100-250 square foot area. Julee only took 17.5 seconds in the second search!

The following month she went to the trail for rats. In TPAT, the search area is 500-1,000 square feet. Julee enjoyed romping in the field on the long line while visiting the judge and photographer. She timed out and was shown the quarry box by the tree. We moved on to the next trial area. This time she ignored the people and found her rats in the shrub and became the first Schip to earn all four PAT titles.

“Unlike agility where the handler provides the cues, in NASDA a handler’s job is to let the dog take the lead and that has been sometimes challenging but always rewarding. Learning to hang back and provide support for my Schips as they problem solve and chase scent is truly wonderful. I very much enjoy this kind of teamwork.” Deb Bruner



Found the rats.

I entered Julee in Level 1 Urban Locating at this trial. The first hide was in a file cabinet drawer left ajar. The area is twice as big, now 250-500 square feet and she had two minutes to hunt. We were in a craft room of a children's campground. She explored the space and brought me a few trinkets she found (scrap of paper and other small items) before discovering the rats. She passed with a few faults (cleaning the floor is not a recognized NASDA skill). Her second search area was in a bunkhouse. She was all business; however the rats presented a puzzle for her. She checked where the box had been for the previous searches (residual odor) and followed the odor into the hallway. I called her back because that was outside of the search area. She picked up the odor and went back to the hallway. This time when she reentered the room she caught the scent behind the door and quickly found the quarry box. Those tricky rats couldn't fool her! Julee is now taking NASDA lessons. I have a timeslot where I can rotate all four of my girls to work on various skills.

Look for NASDA in your area. We've had NASDA trials at AKC events in our area. Happy hunting.

AKC Rolls Out Fit Dog & Fetch Programs

September 2018, AKC launched the AKC Fit Dog program where dog owners who walk a specified distance with their dogs can receive a free AKC Fit Dog car magnet. It has been a great success and now the program has expanded to recognize AKC Fit Dog Clubs, Fit Dog Courses and Fit Dog Titles.

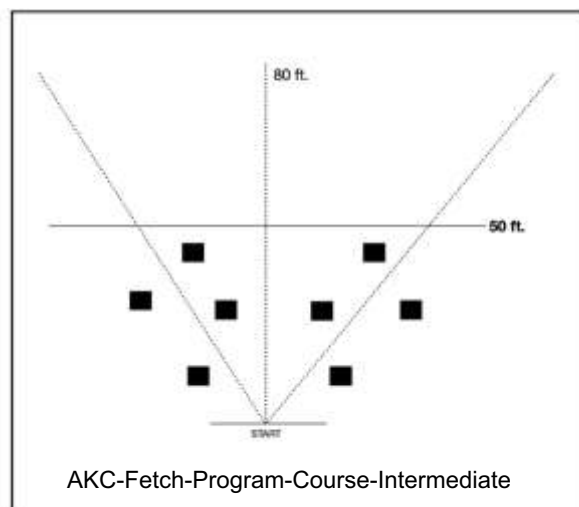


According to the AKC website “when dog owners are asked about activities they like to do with their dogs, the most common responses are to take their dog for a walk and to play ball (fetch) with the dog.” This is the back-story of the two latest AKC titling opportunities in the AKC Family Dog Program. Canine Good Citizen, the very first program in AKC Family Dog. CGC, along with the advanced levels of AKC Community Canine and Urban CGC, teach basic skills such as sit, down, come, and walk on a leash. All these skills are needed for other AKC Family Dog activities.

Now more than ever, fitness is important for both dogs and people. Pets recognize all the same health benefits of physical activity that humans do. Increased performance, decreased risk of injury, lowered stress levels, better sleep habits, and a healthier body and mind. More than 50% of dogs in the US are overweight. 20% of those dogs are considered clinically obese. The most commonly recommended exercise to improve fitness is walking. Walking is considered a safe activity that improves muscular strength, circulation, memory, weight loss, increases energy, helps with sleep, and reduces stress. The American Heart Association recommends walking a minimum of 150 minutes per week. Participation in the AKC Fit Dog program will bring health benefits to both people and dogs. I’ve followed a friend’s weekly walks with her dogs for a few years. She posts photos of their adventures. They’re thriving.

AKC Fit Dog clubs may be approved from existing AKC clubs, independent dog training schools, and other dog related clubs and organizations. These are local groups which meet and accomplish certain fitness goals together with their dogs. To promote health and fitness for dogs and their owners, AKC Fit Dog clubs either conduct at least four group fitness walks per year, or do regularly scheduled canine fitness/conditioning classes. I found a couple of Fit Dog clubs on Facebook and my girls have participated on their virtual walks.

Fit Dog Courses are just one of the ways a dog owner can earn points towards AKC's Fit Dog titles. This fun and fitness-focused curriculum was developed by the AKC in collaboration with Blue-9 Pet Products. Several of their products are highlighted in the courses. Live classes provide the needed training equipment. Virtual classes can be completed using home items. Instructors use positive reinforcement techniques including luring, capturing, and shaping. The focus is on using proper form to ensure the intended muscles are worked. It is very important to note that this program does not address any physical therapy or rehabilitation cases; it is not appropriate for dogs recovering from injuries or post-surgery. There are three levels.



Level 1 is designed to teach foundation skills for a fitness program. Simple fitness exercises stimulate the dog's brain and body, helping eliminate problem behaviors and curb boredom and anxiety. This class also really helps dogs learn to slow down mentally and focus, all the while exercising core and stabilizer muscle groups. It is recommended that participants in the class complete at least a puppy

class or the equivalent. Dogs should understand the training game, and be able to focus on tasks during class. Owners should understand lure-reward based training methods, though capturing and shaping as training concepts may also be used in class.

My 10-month old Schipperke, Julee is currently enrolled in a virtual class. She will graduate the end of February. Skills she is developing, such as tuck sit, fold back down and Cavaletti poles, nest nicely with her other activities (rally, agility fundamentals and Parkour). Others, spin left and right, nose touch and rear leg pivoting will be used for her Novice Trick title. I am a CGC evaluator and have completed all three levels of Fit Dog Instructor course.

Titles added AKC Fit Dog program added a titling option in January 2023. The titles are designed to provide a structured, individualized fitness plan that you can do with your dog. There are three levels of AKC fitness titles - Bronze (FITB), Silver (FITS), and Gold (FITG). Each title requires a specific number of activity points to be completed, which varies based on title level ([5 points](#), [10 points](#) and [20 points](#)). The minimum number of points must be earned in at least two categories. The titles are noncompetitive, and dog owners choose different activities to earn titles. Titles must be earned in sequence.

Within each level, there are six categories of activities to choose from to earn your points. (Details for each category appear in the [Participant Guide](#)):

- A. AKC Fit Dog Course
- B. Runs (community runs such as a Turkey Trot, Spring Scurry, etc.)
- C. Walks and hikes (Independent or Group)
- D. Unique to You and Your Dog (e.g., swimming, Parkour)
- E. AKC title that is fitness related (e.g., FAST CAT, agility)
- F. AKC Parent Club Performance Titles (e.g., pack dog, sledding)

As with all AKC events, there are rules, forms, checklists and documents required. The process is less complicated than it seems initially. AKC provides the following "How to Get Started":

1. Begin by reviewing the AKC Fit Dog Checklists. Each variation of checklists ([Gold](#), [Silver](#), [Bronze](#)) requires various levels of commitment, so it is important to evaluate which level is best suited for you and your dog's activity level.
2. Next, with the checklist in hand, take a look at the [Participant Guide](#) and review the program's rules
3. After reviewing the participant guide and checklist. You must now decide which activities you and your dog would like to complete to earn your title. (I.e., Fit Dog Course, Walks, Swimming, etc.)
4. Once you have completed your specific activities you can fill out the title forms.
5. Submit the 1) Title application, Checklist, and required documentation to <https://www.apps.akc.org/title-application-portal/>

Getting to gold I started working on Fit Dog titles in October 2023 with my girls. FITB only requires six points. We participated in a virtual Barkoberfest walk. I use the free MapMyWalks app on my iPhone. It records the distance, duration, date, time and even our pace (average minutes per mile). Plus it shows a map of your walk. I love it! We received three points for that walk in Category C. My older dogs have AKC titles (see complete list of fitness related titles at the AKC website). So I submitted NAP for Missy, BN for Glory and RN for Jenny in Category E (worth two points). As a puppy, Julee is restricted on titles she can earn. I chose Category D "Unique to You and Your Dog" for her. I contacted AKC to verify that a Parkour Training level title would be acceptable (Training level is the only one available for dogs younger than 18 months). I submitted our first applications via USPS.

There are several items required. First is the Title Application Form, which has your dogs AKC registration information, second is the Checklist, where you identify the categories you are using and finally are Documentation Forms. The organizer of the Barkoberfest walk signed and returned my Documentation forms electronically. Application fee is \$30 per title. Our certificates arrived in about five weeks.

For their FITS titles in December, we participated in two more virtual walks found on Facebook and again recorded them in Category C (worth six points). I used the following titles: RI for Missy, RE for Glory and DCAT for Jenny. This competed their additional four points. I was becoming more familiar with the point system and documenting our activities. We participated in the AKC Turkey Trot 5k in November. In order for Julee to receive credit for the walk, I needed to submit the MapMyWalk screen shot with the documentation form. We also completed another virtual 5k (Reindeer Run) through my local county parks and recreations department. The coordinator of the event electronically signed my documentations. Julee earned six points in Category B (we didn't actually run) as well as the six points in Category C with the older dogs. Again, I sent the forms and payment via USPS. Due to the holidays, certificates took six weeks. Because Julee's paperwork was sent in after the first of the year, her certificate came in three weeks.

FITG requires a fitness related AKC title. *If your dog only has one title, save it for Gold!* The higher your dog's title level is, the more points available in Category E. I used the two 5k runs in Category B (Turkey Trot and Reindeer Run) for the three older dogs. These were worth 12 points. Glory and Jenny got their remaining eight points from the FCAT titles (advanced level). Missy's BCAT was worth two points. She still needed six more. So, I took Missy and Julee on two more Category C walks. I used application portal to apply for the three adults' FITG in January. Their titles appeared on the online records within a week. Julee completed two more Category B runs but still needs an AKC fitness related title. She turns one in April, when the FAST CAT season starts here in western Washington. She'll be ready for gold.

Until further notice, titles previously earned for categories E (Fitness Related AKC titles) and F (Parent Club Performance titles) will be grandfathered. This means that if your dog earned a title before the AKC Fit Dog titles began, you may count it. Each title may only be **counted one time** toward an AKC Fit Dog title. For example, if your dog earned the Novice Agility title before AKC Fit Dog titles began, you may count it. If it was used for the Bronze AKC Fit Dog title, the Novice Agility title may **not** be submitted again.

SCA Versatile Schipperke Program was expanded to include Fit Dog December 2023. The first team to complete their award using Fit Dog titles was Stephanie Woodrow and Ritz.

Fit Dog walks are a great reason to get outside and enjoy time with your Schipperke(s). I am fortunate to have a friend that enjoys walking dogs with me. Please contact me if you have Fit Dog questions or I can help in anyway.

The following are excerpts from the AKC website explaining Fetch.

AKC Fetch titles were created as another activity in which owners could have fun with their dogs in the. Earning AKC Fetch titles provides opportunities for both physical and mental exercise. While some dogs are natural retrievers, AKC Fetch, especially at the advanced levels, will involve teaching new skills such as retrieving. *AKC Fetch is designed for all breeds.*

AKC Fetch is a pass-fail noncompetitive test. The four levels of titles (Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Retriever) assess the ability of the dog to retrieve. In the Advanced and Retriever levels, the dog must respond correctly to signals. There is also a memory component in Advanced and Retriever because a retrieving bumper or ball is dropped (or thrown) behind a blind where it cannot be seen. For each of the four titles, the dog must pass the test twice under two different approved AKC Fetch judges. Dogs six months and older registered with the AKC may participate.

AKC Fetch provides a form of exercise for dogs and their owners. Dogs learn new skills and many handlers will learn to teach a skill (i.e., retrieving) they have not previously taught. Fetch titles are fun to earn and can be used as a required title for earning the **Gold level of Fit Dog**.

Novice dogs earn the FTN (Fetch Novice) title by retrieving a tennis ball (or equivalent), retrieving bumper (also called a dummy) or a toy that has been thrown 30 ft. The course has four distractions. The dog goes between these to retrieve the ball. The dog can see where the ball has been thrown. The distractions are boxes, and the course may include one “un”distraction such as a lawn chair or lawn ornament.

The dog must do three single retrieves. In a single retrieve or “ingle,” one ball is thrown the dog is given the cue by the handler (e.g., “etch it!”, then the dog retrieves and brings the ball to the handler. The 3 singles will be thrown in any order chosen by the handler. There must be one ball thrown to the left, one to the center, and one to the right.

Intermediate dogs earn the FTI (Fetch Intermediate) title by retrieving a tennis ball (or equivalent), bumper, or toy that has been thrown 50 ft. The course has 8 distractions. The dog must go between these to retrieve the ball. The dog can see where the ball has been thrown. The distractions are boxes, and the course may include up to two “un”objects such as a lawn chair, or lawn ornaments. The dog must do four single retrieves. In any order (handler’ choice), these must be one to the left, one to the right, one to center and one more either right or left.

Advanced dogs earn the FTA (Fetch Advanced) title. At this level, retrieving gets serious! The distance for Advanced retrieves is 70 ft. The course has three blinds which are screens at least 24 inches tall, and 10 ft. to 12 ft. wide. As the dog sits at the handler’ side at the start line, a helper drops a bumper behind each blind as the dog watches. The handler may also choose to throw three bumpers/balls over the blinds. The dog must do two single retrieves and two double retrieves. The order is chosen by the handler.

Retriever is the most advanced level of AKC Fetch (FTR Fetch Retriever) titles. The title indicates the dog can do advanced retrieving. Dog must pass the test twice to earn the Retriever title. The distance for the retrieves is 80 ft. and as with Advanced, the course has three blinds. The blinds are at least 24 inches tall and 10 ft. to 12 ft. wide. The dog must do two double retrieves and one triple retrieve. The order of the doubles and the triple is chosen by the handler. The doubles will be to the center, right or left. The triple must be one each center, right, and left (with the order chosen by the handler). Bumpers may be dropped by the helper, or the handler may choose to throw the bumpers/balls or have a helper throw. A Chuckit! may be used.

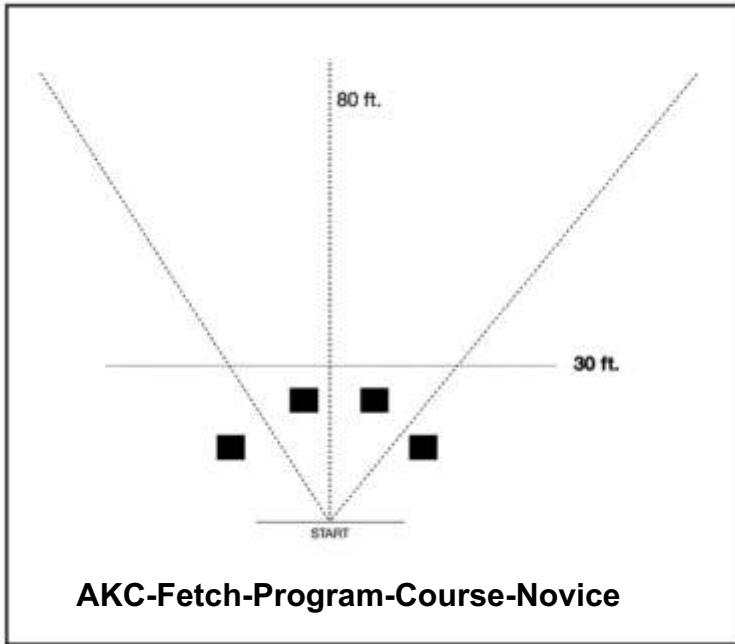

Schipperkes at Work - Linda Webb

Many of us are aware of how we use Schipperkes for showing in conformation and as the family pet. But how many of you are aware of some of the other jobs Schipperkes do? Jobs like search and rescue, therapy, obedience, agility, and service dogs. Schipperkes truly are a very versatile breed. Their quick speed and small, compact body make them an ideal dog for the many jobs we ask of them. Each month, I plan to cover one of these wonderful Schipperkes and the job that they do.

Pat Boggs has four Search and Rescue (SAR) dogs and two up and coming. During an interview, I asked Pat some questions about her work with these wonderful Schipperkes.

****Linda:**** What kinds of work do you and your Schipperkes do?

****Pat:**** In 1992, I got involved in Search and Rescue with K-9's. I chose Schipperkes as my breed. I specialized in cadaver, trailing, and water searches. I moved into disaster, forensic, and burned victims, after certifying in the other fields. Right now, I have one "Live find" that is disaster certified. Bo will only find people who are alive. He is used for lost, missing, and weather-related disasters, where getting out the living is our priority. Fox is now a Mass Casualty certified SAR dog. After the 9/11 bombing, I started to study for what is called CADASTER DOG, which is one able to do disaster searches for human remains, or what is called DNA pieces. He passed in Oct 2003, and we were accepted for National call up in April 2004. He is also a Forensic recovery dog. He helps gather human evidence at the crime scene. Magic is a Cadaver sector dog with a larger zone of search for human remains. He will cover outwards of 500 feet from me and return to "tell" me when he makes a recovery. His specialty is water. He has several "finds" where the water is up to 130 feet deep. He also can find humans who are buried. Magic was a replacement for Wooly, my tracking, trailing, water recovery dog that retired in 2002 at 11 years of age. He had over 40 water recoveries.

****Linda:**** How long have you been working with your Schips in this field?

****Pat:**** I started training in December of 1992. I started a new search unit in 1994, where we have certified special training in murder and criminal investigation as well as the usual wilderness, water, disaster, and urban tracking.

****Linda:**** What does it take for a person to get involved in working with Schipperkes in Search and Rescue?

****Pat:**** The requirements are dedication to training, love of the community, devotion to the saving of humanity, and the love of a very special breed that is intelligent, agile, brave, and filled with high energy. The important part, of course, is TIME. For training (2 years for a basic level), for searches (go at the drop of a hat whenever called), and to help promote the area dogs to local police forces. You have to have skills in problem-solving, radios, compass and map reading, EMT, navigation of wilderness terrain, and crime scene recovery for law enforcement.

****Linda:**** What kind of training does it take to keep up with your Schips' job?

****Pat:**** The first level is just scent comprehension. It's imprinting and teaching indication for either live or dead human. Basic obedience, basic control in agility, and swimming all play a part in the makeup of a basic level dog trainee. The second level takes time for National seminars. I attend at least one a year to keep current and to test my national level dogs for certification, and to add to the basic skills of the foundation. It is here that we build the "specialty" for the dog. It's different for each, according to the talents of each Schip. The third level is at about the fourth year. The dog is now working in the chosen skill, and has passed to the highest level of scent work. The dogs are called out the most for high-profile cases and criminal investigation. They are trustworthy, don't lie, and work independently. They usually have several years of fieldwork in searches and can be relied on to have a higher rate of recovery.

****Linda:**** What is the hardest part for you and your dogs working in this area?

****Pat:**** The stress of recovering children, or maybe being under threat from the drug powers as we investigate the murders. Of course, we are guarded while working, but it does not extend to our homes where we can be under watch and threat if we are required to give evidence against them. Or maybe the sorrow we experience from the families we care so much about.

****Linda:**** Can you tell us about your hardest search?

****Pat:**** I think about all of the 250 searches we have done in the past 12 years, and the last year has been when we are called out far more often. This past March, we got involved in a murder investigation in a small Ozark community that was very much untamed wilderness. The dogs helped to locate evidence of blood and a deep dug-out area where Fox had indicated there might be a body buried. The other 3 dogs with me all confirmed the location. Magic tried to dig it out. The police were digging it up as we left. The situation escalated when the police served a warrant on the neighbor, an extremist, and the officer had been shot. The manhunt lasted all week. On Friday, while at the Memphis show, I learned they had finally found the killers, all three of them. We had assumed the missing wife was also dead, but she was found in their company.

On Tuesday, we got a call back. And Fox HAD been right about the dug-out pit. The murderers had indeed dug it, burned the victim, then scooped him up and moved him somewhere. Our job was to find his scattered bones. Fox, Magic, and two other cadaver search dogs worked along a two-mile back dirt road. About a mile and a half later, we located bone fragments. The forensic anthropologist with us confirmed they were human, but it was Fox that confirmed it. I moved off with a "find more" command. Magic and Fox moved about 100 feet to the left and located the scattered remains that had been plowed and harrowed into the road bed for over 300 feet. The police had been driving back and forth over it for five weeks. The search was now just a recovery for DNA. Fox, along with the other three dogs, located over 150 pieces of bones, teeth, and clothing evidence, no piece larger than a quarter. The teeth and skull fragments had DNA available for identification. The arrest for "murder one" has been filed, and the three are awaiting trial. The case was solved by a small black search dog, after two days of long, hard work. They never shut down or stopped looking. Magic, Fox, and the other two, Dare and Hunter, never gave an inch. Exhausted at times, they would rest for a spell and go back to work. Courage and intelligence in small fur wrappers.

****Linda:**** What is your greatest joy?

****Pat:**** To watch my dog do his job so well that we can make a difference in the life of one family. Even if we don't make a "live" find, we can bring "closure" to the family. The ability to KNOW what happened and lay the loved one in peace. To bring home a lost child, safely.

****Linda:**** What was your most memorable search?

****Pat:**** The search for a cancer survivor child and his brother who were missing in a car accident. The car had plunged into a cold, half-frozen river between Christmas and New Year's. I had two dogs, plus my Schips, working in boats with temperatures in the teens. I desperately wanted to find that child. The first child was recovered along with the car when it was pulled out of the water. The second was still missing. At 2, he was so tiny, and the river long and twisty. I finally located a scent zone and went to rest the Schips. About an hour later, we had his Barney, her purse, a dollar bill, and finally his body. I had hoped for a child I could revive, as mammalian reflexes often allow us to resuscitate a drowned small human in frigid waters. It was not to be. He had sustained head trauma in the accident.

****Linda:**** What kind of awards have you received in this field?

****Pat:**** Many letters of thanks from local law enforcement and Offices of Emergency Services. I was the first runner-up in 2000 and 2001 for the Award Of Excellence from the American Kennel Club. Also, the AKC Award of Excellence first Unit Award ever given for the training and service of five top SAR dogs in 2001.

****Linda:**** What is your mission with your job with your Schips?

****Pat:**** We live to serve, that others may live. To train the very best SAR dog to serve our community and country as needed.

****Linda:**** What other information would you like to share about you and your dogs' job?

****Pat:**** I would like to say that not many understand what goes into working a dog for this type of job. Only one in 35 dogs make it. And of those that do, only one in 50 are ever great enough for the top team. It is a job where we have to get up at any time and GO. It doesn't matter if I am at dinner, sleeping, or at a dog show. The call comes in, we load and leave within 30 minutes. I may be there for a few hours or days. I never know what conditions I will encounter, or what dangers I may face.

I have to think on my feet, carry what I need, and trust my canine companion to the max. And he must trust me the same way. I must be able to give 110% at all times, no matter how tired the dog or I seem to be...a human life is at stake.

My Schips are not only my partners in SAR; they are my closest friends and companions. I take them everywhere. They share my food, my bed, and my everyday life. To reach the levels I have with SAR, and do it with a Schipperke, is a tribute to the breed's strengths and courage. It would never be the same for me with any other breed.
